PRESIDENT'S WELCOME



Dear Members and Friends of the German Society,

Welcome back and a Happy New Year! We hope you all had a great Christmas break.

As usual, we prepared many exciting events for you. But this Hilary term 2019 will be special - it is likely our last Oxford term in the European Union. We, the Oxford German Society, will view this political change as a challenge. Since 1911, it has been one of the society's main aims to support a good understanding between our two nations, to promote cultural exchange, and to create bilateral networks amongst Oxford students. This will become more important than ever and therefore, European unity and Anglo-German friendship will lead us through Hilary term 2019.

We start with a discussion and Q&A with Prof. Buchan, the University's Head of Brexit Strategy, about the future of the University of Oxford and the consequences of Brexit on us as students. Later in the term, the *European Evening* - an inaugural event with performances and music - will celebrate the idea of a united Europe; *Abendbrot* will strengthen our bonds with our British friends; and finally, we will gather with our friends from other European Oxford Societies.

But Brexit is only one of a number of pressing topics in the world these days. To give us an insight into the role of science and scientific research in political discussion and decision making in times of fake news and populism, we invited Dr. Heinen, the head of research services of the *Bundestag*. We will also be joined by Andrea Schumacher, the vice-president of the German Federal Office for Migration and Refugees (BAMF), with whom we will discuss the European migrant crisis of 2015 and the role of the BAMF. In our media week, representatives from some of Germany's largest newspapers will explain the importance and impact of their work. We will also discuss the culture of exciting and controversial debates.

And as always, we look forward to welcoming you to a great number of social events: our *Kaffee & Kuchen*, a joint wine and cheese event with the French Society, and our Stammtische. We are also invited to go to London and Cambridge this term and hope to see many of you at our two great day-trips boasting an exciting programme.

Please check out our weekly beginners and advanced German language classes and spread the word amongst your friends! We have fantastic teachers and all language classes are free for members.

Finally, Hilary term will be the last term of the current committee. Please join us at our annual general meeting on Sunday, the 17th of February to elect the future committee. If you are interested in getting involved in the German Society, please do not hesitate to contact us or get to know us at our meet-and-greet on the 6th of February. Hope to see you at one of our many events.

Dr. Guido Heinen, Head of Research Services of the Bundestag



The Head of Research Services of the German Parliament, the Bundestag, will join us for a talk and discussion about the interaction between politics, research and science, and knowledge management.

Dr. Heinen studied Catholic theology, philosophy and law at the Universities of Würzburg and Swiss Freiburg, eventually gaining a

doctoral degree in theology. After training to be a journalist, he worked as an editor in the director's office and later as the head of department for domestic policy for the national newspaper *Die Welt*. Particularly, he published work on the financing of political parties, organised crime and secret services. In 2006, he was appointed director of press and communication of the German Bundestag. Further, he served as the spokesman to the president of the Bundestag, Norbert Lammert. He has been the head of research services to the Bundestag since 2011.

Join us for what promises to be a fascinating discussion about the German Parliament and Dr. Heinen's work in bringing truth to politics in an age of alternative facts and fake news.

The talk and Q&A will be held in German. This event is open to everyone.

Prof. Alastair Buchan, Head of the University's Brexit Strategy



What will come after Brexit? What is going to change for us as students at Oxford University? Prof. Alastair Buchan, Head of Brexit Strategy of the University of Oxford and Pro-Vice Chancellor, will return to the German Society for a discussion evening and Q&A. Prof. Buchan currently holds the chair of stroke research and has successfully initiated the Berlin Partnership programme, a new

research collaboration with the three universities of Berlin and the Charité.

Andrea Schumacher, Vice President of the German Federal Office for Migration and Refugees (BAMF)



Andrea Schumacher is vice president of the German Federal Office for Migration and Refugees (BAMF) since June 2018. Before her current position, she worked in a range of departments in the Ministry of the Interior. After working in and directing the departments on co-operation against international terrorism and for international police co-operation, she was Germany's Permanent

Representative in the EU as Head of Interior Policy I (refugees, migration and external borders) from 2012 to 2017. In 2017, she became Permanent Representative in NATO as Head of Civil Defence/Security of the Interior.

We are excited to hear from Ms. Schumacher about the BAMF's role in the refugee influx of 2015, the developments since then and an outlook into the future.

The talk will be held in German and is followed by a Q&A.

Prof. Jonathan Wolff, British Philosopher



Jonathan Wolff is a British philosopher, well-known not only as holder of the Blavatnik Chair in Public Policy, but particularly among Politics undergraduates for his Introduction to Political Philosophy. A pupil of G.A. Cohen at University College London, he has written on Marxism, Nozick and inequality.

After the experiences in the GDR, Marxism is viewed in Germany mostly as naive or dangerous. In our Fireside Talk, we hope to examine how perspectives on Marx differ between Britain and Germany, and to gain insights into why he might be still relevant today.

The discussion will be held in English.
