

Olaf Scholz, Vice Chancellor and Federal Minister of Finance



Olaf Scholz is a German politician and member of the social democratic party (SPD). He is Germany's current Vice Chancellor and Federal Minister of Finance. Before, he served as Mayor of Hamburg from 2011 to 2018 and as Federal Minister of Labour and Social Affairs from 2007 to 2009. Mr Scholz has held several roles within his party - Secretary-General (2002-2004) and Deputy Party Leader (2009-2019) to name only two of them. In December of 2019, he lost the election for the party's leadership after receiving the most votes in the first round.

Mr. Scholz is considered part of the conservative wing within the SPD. He is a supporter of the SPD's "grand coalition" with the Christian democratic party (CDU). As Minister of Finance, he has continued his predecessor's policy of zero net debt ("Schwarze Null"). Among the policies he has suggested are a tax on financial transactions and an EU-wide insurance for unemployment during economic shocks.

The talk will be held in German and will be followed by a Q&A session. This event is open to everyone.

Dr. Dani Kranz, Researcher in Migration and Antisemism



Dr. Dani Kranz works as an academic at Ben Gurion University, Israel, and as an applied academic and director of Two Foxes Consulting, Germany. Trained in anthropology, social psychology and history, her thematic expertise covers migration, ethnicity, law, state/stateliness, political life, organisations as well as memory politics. She has been conducting long-term fieldwork in Europe and the Middle East. Her current work concerns the genesis of moral economies as well as Jewish life and the fight against antisemitism as a consultant to the German high commissioner for Jewish

life, and against antisemitism.

The talk and discussion will be in German.

Prof. Alastair Buchan, Head of the University's Brexit Strategy



How will Brexit affect university life? What is going to change for us as students at Oxford University? Prof. Alastair Buchan, Head of Brexit Strategy of the University of Oxford and Pro-Vice Chancellor, will return to the German Society for a discussion evening and Q&A. Prof. Buchan currently holds the chair of stroke research and has successfully initiated the Berlin Partnership programme, a new research collaboration with the three universities of Berlin and the Charité.

The discussion and Q&A will be held in English - Everyone is welcome!

Dr. Thomas Steffen, State Secretary at the Federal Ministry of Health

Thomas Steffen is State Secretary at the Federal Ministry of Health since 2019. He has previously served in various positions at the Federal Ministry of Finance (BMF), including as State Secretary from 2012 to 2017. A lawyer by training, Steffen has served on a variety of German and European financial and economic committees and boards, including the European Stability Mechanism.

We are looking forward to discussing a variety of topics with Dr. Steffen. How does he look back on his career in the German civil service and what advice would he give to anyone going into it? Where does he feel that he has had a real impact on policy making? How can the German health system become fit for the future and how can we deal with the challenge of demographic change and an aging population? What role will the Federal Ministry of Health play in this?

The discussion and Q&A will be held in German.
