Mirko Drotschmann - German Youtuber, Journalist and Author

Mirko Drotschmann (otherwise known as 'MrWissen2Go') is a German Youtuber, journalist and author focusing on online video production. In his career, he has worked with numerous public broadcasters such as ARD, ZDF, SWR, and MDR. His videos cover historical topics and provide intriguing commentary on contemporary debates. They have aroused a great amount of interest which is mirrored in his more than 1.2 million subscribers on Youtube alone. Furthermore, he is an advisor on digital topics to the state

government of Rhineland-Palatinate. In this interview, he will talk to us about his career as a journalist and how opinions are formed on the internet: What role do influencers have on the internet and how can this role impact public opinion? What responsibilities do influencers have as such? How has and how will access to information change our society? Join us for what promises to be an insightful discussion about a topic that is highly relevant for the future of journalism, media, and our society.

Dorothee Bär - State Minister for Digitalisation (CSU)



Dorothee Bär is a German politician from the CSU currently serving as Minister of State for Digitalisation at the Federal Chancellery (Bundeskanzleramt) in Berlin. She has been a member of the German Bundestag since 2002 and the Vice Chairwoman of the CSU since 2017. Her previous roles include posts as a Parliamentary State Secretary to the Federal Minister of Transport and Digital Infrastructure and as a Spokeswoman of the CDU/CSU parliamentary group in the German Bundestag on family affairs, senior citizens, women and youth. In this interview, she will talk about her experiences as a politician and lawmaker in digital policies. The discussion will centre around how digital policies are

shaping society: One important topic will be data security, especially the new EU data protection regulation (EU-Datenschutzgrundverordnung). We will also discuss how the COVID-19 pandemic impacts the way we interact, study and work (online). So, look forward to what promises to be an exciting event on our digital future with one of Germany's leading politicians in this field.

Timur Vermes - Best-selling German Author



Timur Vermes is a best-selling German author, known for both 'Guess Who's Back' (German: 'Er ist wieder da') and 'The Hungry and the Fat' (German: 'Die Hungrigen und die Satten'). Both books provide a well-founded and intriguing criticism of German society focusing on issues relevant to everyone. In this interview, he is going to talk to us about his writing principles and motives: How does he create the dystopian scenarios in his novels whilst keeping the right balance between absurdity and reality? How far away from reality are they actually? And what is his opinion on the general role of literature in the political world? Furthermore, we will discuss with him how to overcome societal challenges in general, particularly with regard to the issues he deals with in his

books: the coping with the German past, methods of the media branch and the refugee crisis. This will be a discussion with a wide range of topics, and certainly interesting for everyone.
