

Dr. Helge Braun – Head of the Federal Chancellery



Dr. Helge Braun is a German medical doctor and politician from the CDU, currently serving as Head of the Chancellery, and Federal Minister for Special Affairs. He has been a member of the German Bundestag from 2002 to 2005 and 2009 to present, serving as deputy leader of the Hessian MPs. He has previously been a Parliamentary Secretary of State at the Chancellery for Bureaucracy Reduction and Federal-State Relations and in the Ministry for Education and Research. In this interview, he will talk about his career in politics, the role of the Chancellery in Federal/State relations as well as the opportunities offered by the German presidency of the EU Council for fighting the

COVID-19 pandemic and shaping the foreign policy of the European Union. Look forward to an insight into the inner workings of the German government.

Carola Rackete – Humanitarian Activist



Carola Rackete is a German humanitarian activist, member of Sea Watch and former captain of the ship "Sea-Watch 3". She has gained international attention for her role in the rescue of 53 migrants in the Mediterranean Sea and her subsequent controversial clashes with the Italian government for which she was put under brief house arrest. Besides that, she is also a supporter of the movement Extinction Rebellion. This event is going to centre around human rights in the light of the climate crisis and environmental destruction. Furthermore, she will focus on her book "Handeln statt Hoffen" (English: "Act instead of Hoping") which focuses on civic engagement and a postgrowth society. Look forward to an event where we talk about the defining problems of our generation and on how we could solve them.

Prof. Fabiola Gerpott – Chair of Leadership at the WHU



Professor Fabiola Gerpott is a German academic and Chair of Leadership at the WHU – Otto Beisheim School of Management. She is in the midst of a stellar career, having taught and contributed at numerous universities around the world, and focuses on emergent leadership, leader communication as well as diversity and knowledge management.

In this interview, she will focus on the myths surrounding diversity management and the widely debated 'Frauenquote' (literally: 'women's quota') on boards and committees in the business world. Furthermore, we will talk about different approaches to diversity management and how "Schubladendenken" (stereotyped thinking)

affects diversity initiatives and what might need to change in our discourse to be inclusive to everyone. Join us for an intriguing discussion with a rising star in the academic world.

Andreas Michaelis – German Ambassador to the UK



Andreas Michaelis is the current German Ambassador to the United Kingdom and former State Secretary to the German Foreign Office. He has also served as Ambassador to Israel and Singapore. He will talk to us about his career at the German Foreign Office, the relationship between the United Kingdom and Germany as well as the changes that Brexit might be about to bring to this relationship. Being an Oxford

alumnus himself and having worked at the heart of German foreign policy, he will offer an intriguing perspective into what the future holds. Whatever questions you might have about Germany, foreign policy or Brexit, this is the time and place to ask them.

CORONA CONVERSATIONS





In this interview series, co-hosted with the Cambridge University German Society, we seek to answer some of the most pressing questions of the current crisis: How bad will the second wave get? When will we have a vaccine and how will it work? How have previous pandemics shaped the global order and what can we learn from the past? Our discussions with leading German experts will shed light on the medical, epidemiological, and societal aspects of the COVID-19 pandemic. This is also your chance to ask any questions you have about coronavirus and its consequences - and have them answered by a leading expert in the field. Join us for what promises to be an insightful discussion about the topic that is and will remain relevant for the foreseeable future.

All interviews will be held in German.

Professor Eva Grill - Epidemiologist



Professor Eva Grill is an epidemiologist at the Ludwig Maximilian University of Munich and President of the German Society for Epidemiology (DGEpi). A pharmacist by training, she is now focussing on several aspects of public health and epidemiology. Her expertise lies in understanding the aetiology (causes) of diseases in the public. In March, she and her team were involved in modelling how political decisions might impact the number of infections and subsequent need for intensive care units in Germany.

Professor Philipp Osten – Medical Historian



Professor Philipp Osten is a medical historian and Director of the Insitute of History and Ethics of Medicine at the University Hospital Hamburg-Eppendorf.

In his numerous books and publications, he has extensively studied the political and societal impact of major historic epidemics of infectious diseases ranging from the plague, cholera and tuberculosis to the current outbreak of COVID-19. He describes the current pandemic as a historic turning point and has already initiated the collection of items related to the current pandemic to be part of museum exhibitions in the future.

Our discussion with him will allow us to look at the current pandemic through a historic lens and understand how major historic events currently shape political decisions and our society.

Professor Marylyn Addo - Infectiologist



Professor Marylyn Addo is a German infectiologist and Head of the Division of Infectious Diseases at the German Center for Infection Research (DZIF) in Hamburg and leader of the working group 'Clinical Management, Epidemiology and Immunology of Newly Emerging Infections'. Her group was involved in developing an Ebola and MERS vaccine which is now being tested in clinical trials and she is currently developing a viral vector-based vaccine against COVID-19. In the interview with Professor Addo, we will explore recent vaccine developments and understand how infectious diseases pose an emerging threat to global public health.
